SELECTED ACHIEVEMENTS

- **Programming & curation:** curated program of artists for the Circus Arts Incubator at Circus Oz. Significantly more applications were received than expected, with places available for only one in two applicants, so selection criteria and inclusion lenses were applied to separate & rank applications.
- Arts sector analysis: undertook in-depth research project on the Melbourne circus classes sector, including industry trends, market & competitor analyses, product comparisons and financial modelling. Full findings from the final report went to Board and Executive, and I also presented findings to members of the wider circus classes sector.
- **Cultural policy research & sector consultation:** completed Master's Thesis focusing on working conditions and experiences of short-term arts festival workers in Australia & the UK. Gathered qualitative data via interviews and focus groups. Awarded first class honours for final submission.
- Artist application support: designed and implemented application & selection process for the Circus Arts Incubator. All applicants were offered feedback sessions following selection announcement and I delivered 25+ individual feedback sessions over 2 weeks.
- **Program evaluation:** drove an evaluation partnership with Dr Clare Hall from Monash University to document program outcomes and impacts. Future programs secured funding as a result of high quality evaluation and reporting from that pilot year. (Melbourne International Jazz Festival)
- **Detailed reporting & documentation:** Prepared comprehensive handover reports for 10+ festival contracts, documenting processes, evaluating outcomes against goals & providing recommendations for future festivals.
- **Project management & budgeting:** Over a decade working independently as a producer and arts manager in which I have managed 20+ budgets (\$10,000-\$800,000) in Excel, for funding, Board/Executive, departmental, projects & touring.
- **Produced award-winning shows**: Produced shows have been recognised with awards from Melbourne Fringe, Adelaide Fringe & MICF, and nominations from Perth Fringeworld, Edinburgh Fringe & Green Room Awards
- **Partnership negotiation:** secured \$34,000 of all-new funding for Drama Victoria Theatre Festival in 2019
